Prior to coronavirus a key issue for all levels of government and business was the matter of trust. In some ways the experience of the pandemic, in South Australia especially, could result in a strengthening of community trust in government and business. However, there is still much to do - especially for local government. The new and invigorated industries are likely to resonate deeply with SA's core strengths like agribusiness, manufacturing, defence and to which might be added

The key to creating stronger local communities in the 2020s, Bernard Salt will argue, is strong social cohesion, a skilled workforce, a preparedness to adapt by both workers and businesses and a grand vision for local councils, for Adelaide, for the state, that maps out a pathway to a more prosperous, connected and fairer community by 2030.

Bernard Salt AM is one of Australia's leading thinkers, writers and presenters on this most important issue and will tailor his presentation specifically to South Australia's local government context.
