IMPORTANT NOTICE TO STAFF, MEMBERS, PROGRAM PARTICIPANTS, EVENT ATTENDEES, SPONSORS AND SUPPLIERS

This advice is regarding COVID-19 (formerly known as novel coronavirus) for the attention of LG Professionals SA employees, members, program participants, event attendees, sponsors and suppliers.

Please note this information is current as of today's date. We encourage you to stay updated via the Australian Government Department of Health website www.health.gov.au

While the number of cases of COVID-19 is currently small in Australia, it is possible that this situation could change at any time, and it is vital that you are prepared and have a plan in place for a change in situation. Coronavirus (COVID-19) is a respiratory illness caused by a new virus. Symptoms range from a mild cough to pneumonia. Some people recover easily, others may get very sick very quickly.

There is evidence that it spreads from person to person. Good hygiene can prevent infection. Surgical masks in the community are only helpful in preventing people who have coronavirus disease from spreading it to others. If you are well, you do not need to wear a surgical mask as there is little evidence supporting the widespread use of surgical masks in healthy people to prevent transmission in public. Everyone should practise good hygiene to protect against infections.

Good hygiene includes:

- washing your hands often with soap and water
- using a tissue and covering your mouth when you cough or sneeze
- avoiding close contact with others, such as touching including handshakes

Who is most at risk of a serious illness?

From previous experience with other coronaviruses, the people at most risk of serious infection are:

- people with compromised immune systems, such as people with cancer
- elderly people
- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people
- very young children and babies, and
- people with diagnosed chronic medical conditions.
