Overview

In an increasingly complex environment, such experiences are likely becoming more frequent.

We find ourselves bumping up against the limits of the effectiveness of our usual problem-defining and problem-solving approaches. It's not that we need to abandon our usual approaches; rather, we need to expand them.

Organisations are systems, and when we learn to see the relationship between structure and behaviour in our system, we can understand how we might shift structures to enable different/better behaviour patterns. That is systems thinking.

LG Professionals SA are pleased to present this one-day 'Foundations' program with guest international facilitator Dr Barry Bales. The program will introduce systems thinking skills that will enable you to effectively define and address organisational challenges. To make this program as practical as possible, participants will practise using their new systems thinking concepts in addressing a real organisational challenge they currently face.

Grow your ability to:

- ∴ Understand the different levels of thinking that result in different framing of problems.
- ∴ Ask systems questions to identify the structures better influencing behaviours.
- ∴ Look for "cause and effect" links that can help you better understand patterns of behaviour.
- ∴ Identify the pressures that drive short-term decisions (and erode long-term organisational capacities).
- ∴ Identify interventions more likely to have an impact.

Outcomes you can expect

- ∴ Be able to apply the basic concepts and principles of systems thinking to better understand organisational issues and problems.
- ∴ Better understand why change initiatives fail and use systems thinking principles in a step-by-step process to more effectively design and implement these initiatives.
- ∴ Ask systems questions to understand better and anticipate current and possible future behaviours.
- ∴ Be more thoughtful about where to intervene to have the biggest impact on system redesign.
