Overview

Effective leaders today typically have high IQs, extensive education, years of experience, and deep knowledge in their fields. As valuable as these skills and abilities are, none of these factors help predict who will be successful as a leader and who won't.

What more is needed? The answer is "emotional intelligence," or EQ as it's commonly called, a concept that has been around for years and is still not widely understood. Research in the EQ field has found that EQ is the *single biggest predictor of performance in the workplace* (it accounts for 58% of performance in all types of jobs!) and the strongest driver of leadership and personal excellence. Furthermore, there is no known connection between IQ and EQ – you can't predict EQ based on how smart someone is. But here is the really good news- while IQ is basically fixed at birth, a high EQ can be developed even if you aren't born with it.

This interactive Masterclass will help you to understand what emotional intelligence really is, learn specific strategies for enhancing and managing your EQ, and practice applications for leveraging EQ in a leadership role.
